- 5. Money raised.

Ossoli Awards from GFWC-TN Convention

For 2013, GFWC Ossoli Circle received 5 First Place Awards from GFWC Tennessee at the 2014 Spring Convention held in Johnson City, TN.

- Leadership--Lexa and Roberta did a great job of record keeping and many members attended district and state GFWC meetings.
- GFWC International Outreach Partnerships—Members supported Operation Smile, Heifer, and UNICEF.
- **GFWC Public Issues Partnerships**—You donated 120 multiple occasion cards to the USO "Cards for Troops" project.
- GFWC Women's History and Resource Center—Supporting our Historic clubhouse requires much fundraising and hard work. Other Projects reported were the play on Founder's Day and donations to WHRC, the 1734 Society, and Old Gray Cemetery, where Lizzie Crozier French is buried.
- GFWC Signature Project: Domestic Violence Projects—The Ossoli In Action party garnered \$2243.21 and in-kind donations of \$1000 for Lexa's signature project, The Next Door. A moving play directed by Jo Webb about domestic violence was presented to the members.

GFWC Ossoli Circle was awarded 3 Second Place Awards.

- Fundraising—In 15 projects, we raised \$22,534.79 with 2362.5 hours of work.
- **Membership**—Nine different membership activities (orientation, hospitality, courtesy, programs, luncheons, yearbook, newsletter, publicity, contact, webmaster, membership coffee, our pictorial directory, trips, memorial service, Presidents' Day, and duties of our membership chairman) were reported.
- **GFWC International Outreach**—Projects included our donations to African ELI and Dream Home as well as programs about Russia, Poland, Israel, and Alaska.

Submitted by Ossoli Circle, Conor Metz won First Place in the State Contest for his poem "Chubby". Six Ossoli members were awarded certificates for their achievements in ESO for reading books. Janice Hixson was our Outstanding Club Woman nominee and Nancy Carmon our Rookie of the Year nominee.

Even with all these wonderful awards and achievements, we can do more!. Next year let's win Outstanding Club because we are!
