FREE MEDICAL CLINIC OF AMERICA

President Sarah Searle chose the Free Medical Clinic of America as her project for the year. The clinic, founded in 1993 by Dr. Tom Kim, provides free medical care to those legal Knox County residents, who are employed but uninsured and are in need of basic medical care. Several Ossoli Circle members volunteer at the clinic.

Penny Keim is leading the effort to create a cookbook as a fund raiser for the clinic. The Ossoli in Action Committee, in support of the President's Project, donated \$500 toward the cost of creating the cookbook. Ossoli members donated \$1535 and an anonymous local family foundation donated \$1000, all of which cover the publishing costs, so all proceeds from the cookbook sales will go to the clinic.

OSSOLI CIRCLE MEMORIAL FUND

The Ossoli Circle Memorial Fund was established in 1979. When an Ossoli member, husband or other family member, or friend of Ossoli dies, family and friends are encouraged to honor this person by donating to the Memorial Fund. Ossoli Circle makes a donation "in memory" of any

current member or current member's immediate family upon their death. The funds are used by the Contact Committee to send get-well wishes to members, greetings to Honorary Associate members, and for other needs as identified by the Board of Directors. The fund is managed by the Trustees of Ossoli Circle.
