It is hard to believe we are already in a new year and moving forward with exciting and new programs and fun events planned at Ossoli Circle for the first half of 2023.

Looking back at some of the highlights in October, my President's project, Alzheimer's Association Tennessee Chapter in Knoxville began with our Walk to End Alzheimer's at Zoo Knoxville on Saturday October 8. GFWC Ossoli Circle Team was well represented with 8 members and 5 guests who walked and had a chance to tour the Zoo afterwards. In addition, our campaign to raise money for Alzheimer's Walk continued throughout the year. We had a generous outpouring of donations from our members, and by the end of December, Ossoli Team had reached our goal of \$4,500. Our Club was awarded a special plaque as a top team producer for our fundraising support and partnership in 2022. The award we received was for Ossoli Circle being recognized as the 2022 Grand champion for our fundraising efforts for this year's Walk. My thanks to all of you who participated in this special event and for all those members who donated generously for the cause. For those of you who would like to donate this year, we will be collecting ALZ donations through the middle of May.

HonorAir Knoxville, one of our community service projects, took place on October 12. Its mission is to take WWII, Korean, and Vietnam veterans from East Tennessee to Washington, D.C. for the day to visit the memorials built to honor their sacrifices. This special flight originated from McGhee Tyson Airport. Ossoli Circle members, working in tandem with the Tellico Village Women's Club, prepared appreciation bags for each of the female veterans flying on HonorAir Flight 31. This partnership proved to be a successful and enjoyable event after three years in the making. Thanks to Janie Bitner and Wanda Taylor for coordinating these details.

Another memorable program was on October 10 when Kellie Harper, UT Lady Vols' Head Basketball coach, discussed ways to inspire women to be the best we can be. You could have heard a pin drop as she spoke to our crowded audience. I honestly believe her speech was one of the most inspirational ones I had ever heard. A big thanks to our member, Faith Yandell, for arranging and confirming Kellie as one of our speakers.

Saturday, October 22 was the GFWC Smoky Mountain District Conference in Chattanooga where Host Club Valamont had made all of the arrangements for this one-day event. Ossoli was well represented with nine members in attendance. This was an informative day as Wanda Taylor, Smoky Mountain District President, made her debut.

October 24 was our Replacement benefit that coincided with Halloween and aptly named "Ossoli Circle House of Horrors". It was a huge success. Many members wore appropriate Halloween costumes and purchased baked goodies and enjoyed bidding on the silent auction items. A whopping \$3,545.00 was raised from our special party. A big round of applause

goes to Wanda Taylor and Janie Bitner, Co-chairs, who rose to the occasion for the planning, coordination, and execution of this fun event.

One of our programs on October 31 was given by Nancy Carmon, Chair of Legislation and Resolutions. She explained what a GFWC Resolution is. On November 14, another member who also serves on the Board, Patricia Harris, gave her presentation about her recent trip to Southwest France. As many of you know, Patricia was a French teacher at Bearden High School for many years and has enjoyed her annual trips to France where she has opportunities to brush up on her French.

Founder's Day at Ossoli Circle was on November 21 and commemorated our 137th anniversary. This day centered around key founders who were played by members participating in specific roles.
