Service projects so far this year have included making bags of healthy treats and foods for The Love Kitchen and handbags for the Hope Project containing toiletries in a beautiful handbag with a scarf for victims of domestic violence. We participated in GFWC National Day of Service to combat food insecurity and hunger across the U.S. GFWC members collected 221,142 pounds of nonperishable food, recorded 18,159 volunteer hours, collected \$242,731 in monetary donations for food pantries and school feeding programs and prepared 69,660 meals. What an honor to be a part of such a wonderful organization.

We have had some educational and interesting programs so far this year, including a visit from the owls at the Owl Ridge Raptor Center. I have forgiven Nugget, the sweet little owl that "christened" me. What a fabulous time we all had learning about the owls and making photos.

Shot@Life is a United Nations Foundation campaign working to ensure everyone in the world has access to lifesaving vaccines and all children have a shot at life. GFWC chapters around the world support global childhood immunization in local communities by holding events, raising money, and advocating to our elected officials.

Every 20 seconds, a child dies from a vaccinepreventable disease, resulting in 1.5 million deaths every year and accounting for nearly a third of all childhood deaths? Vaccines are one of the safest, most cost-effective ways to save children's lives, improve health, and ensure longterm economic prosperity

This year we also celebrate the 50th anniversary of routine immunization campaigns that have reduced child mortality by 80% and saved a billion lives. Many GAVI countries (Vaccine Alliance) are paying part or all the cost for their vaccination programs.
